Grammar Rules

1. Present Simple with Third Person: Add 's' to verbs when using he/she/it or names. Luna is one person, so we say 'Luna walks' not 'Luna walk'.
2. Adjectives Before Nouns: Put describing words before the thing they describe. This is the English word order that sounds natural.
3. Articles A/An/The: Use 'a' before consonant sounds, 'an' before vowel sounds. Use 'the' when talking about something specific.
4. Question Formation: Start questions with question words like what, where, when. Put the question word first in the sentence.
5. Present Continuous for Actions: Use 'is/am/are + verb-ing' for actions happening now. This shows Luna is doing something right now.
6. Plural Nouns: Add 's' to make nouns plural (more than one). Most English nouns just need 's' at the end.
