■ Essential Vocabulary

Word	Definition	Example
magic	special powers that seem impossible	The wizard used magic to fly.
friendship	a close relationship between friends	Their friendship lasted many years.
adventure	an exciting and dangerous experience	They went on a great adventure.
discover	to find something for the first time	I discovered a new book.
enchanted	having magical qualities	The enchanted forest was beautiful.
spell	magic words that make things happen	She cast a spell on the door.
wizard	a man who can do magic	The wizard wore a long robe.
brave	not afraid of danger	The brave knight fought the dragon.
mysterious	strange and difficult to understand	The house looked mysterious at night.
powerful	having great strength or ability	The king was very powerful.
trust	to believe someone is honest	I trust my best friend.
journey	a trip from one place to another	The journey took three days.
protect	to keep someone safe from harm	Parents protect their children.
courage	the ability to face danger	She showed great courage.
wonder	to think about something	I wonder what time it is.

■ Key Phrases

Let's go on an adventure → Let's go on an adventure | **I can help you** → I can help you | **What a magical place** → What a magical place | **We're best friends** → We're best friends | **That's incredible** → That's incredible | **Let me try** → Let me try

■ Grammar Rules

- Present Simple for abilities: Use present simple to describe what people can do regularly. Add 's' with he/she/it.
- Modal 'can' for abilities: Use 'can' to talk about abilities and possibilities. It doesn't change form.
- Adjectives before nouns: Put describing words before the noun they describe. Use 'very' for emphasis.
- Past simple for stories: Use past simple for completed actions in stories. Regular verbs add -ed.
- Question formation with 'can': Put 'can' before the subject to make questions. No 'do' needed.
- Plural nouns: Add 's' to make most nouns plural. Some are irregular.
