■ Grammar Rules

- Present Simple for Descriptions: Use present simple to describe characters and their qualities. Add 's' for third person singular.
- Adjectives Before Nouns: Put describing words directly before the noun. Use articles 'a' or 'the' correctly.
- Can for Ability: Use 'can' + base verb to express ability. It's the same for all persons.
- Past Simple for Stories: Use past tense to tell stories. Regular verbs add 'ed', irregular verbs change completely.
- So + Adjective: Use 'so' before adjectives to show strong feeling. It makes the description stronger.
- Christmas Vocabulary: Learn special Christmas words and expressions. They're used during the holiday season.
