1. Use contractions in casual speech: I'm sounds more natural than I am. Native speakers use contractions in informal situations.
2. Match formality to situation: Business meetings need formal language. Social events allow casual introductions.
3. Add context after your name: Include relevant information like job, department, or connection. This helps conversation flow.
4. Show interest in others: After introducing yourself, ask about them. This creates friendly conversation.
5. Use appropriate tone: Your voice and attitude matter. Sound confident but friendly in introductions.
6. Practice natural rhythm: English has natural stress patterns. Practice the rhythm of introduction phrases.
