open	to make something not closed	Please open the window
close	to shut something	Close the door behind you
beautiful	very nice to look at	The garden is beautiful
adventure	exciting experience	We had a great adventure
surprise	something unexpected	What a nice surprise!
discover	to find something new	We discover a secret place
mysterious	strange and unknown	The house looks mysterious
enter	to go inside	May I enter the room?
wonder	to think about something	I wonder what's inside
curious	wanting to know more	She is curious about everything
path	way to walk	Follow the path to the house

■ Key Phrases

What's behind the door? → What's behind the door? | Let's explore together → Let's explore together | I wonder if... → I wonder if... | How exciting! → How exciting! | This looks mysterious → This looks mysterious | I'm curious about... → I'm curious about...

■ Grammar Rules

1. Present Tense Questions: Use 'do/does' for present tense questions. Does for he/she/it, do for others.
2. Adjective Order: Adjectives go before nouns in English. Multiple adjectives have specific order.
3. Simple Present Statements: Add 's' to verbs with he/she/it. No 's' with I/you/we/they.
4. There is/There are: Use 'there is' for singular, 'there are' for plural things.
5. Prepositions of Place: Use in/on/at for different locations. In for enclosed spaces.
6. Modal Can for Ability: Use 'can' to talk about ability. Don't add 's' after can.
