Grammar Rules

- Past Tense Regular Verbs: Add -ed to regular verbs for past tense. Stories usually happen in the past.
- Irregular Past Tense: Some verbs change completely in past tense. Learn common irregular verbs for stories.
- Was/Were Usage: Use was for I/he/she/it and were for you/we/they in past tense.
- Adjective Order: Put adjectives before nouns. Use opinion before fact adjectives.
- There was/were: Use for introducing new things in stories. Was for singular, were for plural.
- Story Sequence Words: Use first, then, next, finally to show story order and connect events.
